A LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Beloved Church of St. Luke, I have been your pastor for just over a month! God is good, gracious, and faithful. It has been a joy serving you thus far. As many of you know, we have been studying the prophet Isaiah's prayer in chapter 63 and 64 of his book. The prayer is a calling and yearning for God to "come down." Isaiah longed for the presence of God to restore, revive, and renew Israel as God's chosen people.

Within the period of Isaiah (pre-Christ), there was a restoration of God's people in their land (Israel). Under the Priest Ezra and Administrator Nehemiah, God's temple is rebuilt! At last, we see a more profound longing in Isaiah and the people. They don't merely desire the temple or Israel restored - they desire God to dwell with them in fullness! They crave the coming day of their Messiah. Isaiah and the people of Israel knew the covenant promise of ultimate renewal. They knew that God desired to restore them to where He is. They knew the promise of a Redeemer who would set all things right. Israel, just 400 years before the birth of Christ, would find themselves in a period of waiting - again. The -"now, but not yet!"

We are in a similar Advent season. Advent is not merely four weeks before Christmas. It is year-round. Advent simply means "coming." As Isaiah predicted, the Messiah did come! Jesus Christ accomplished His mission and defeated sin and death on the cross. He then gave His Church a job to do and promised to return again - to set all things right and take us to where He is (John 14:2). We are (like Israel) in a period of, "now, but not yet."It is for this reason that I encourage you to view this advent season with not only anticipation for Christmas, but a longing for Christ's final return. Remember the first week of our study in Isaiah, "We MISS you!" It is this tension (a paradox if you will) that carries an element of darkness and angst. Our world is still full of suffering, death, tears, and brokenness. We are in the morning hours before the dawn, where Christ will "wipe every tear away," (Revelation 21:4).

As Theologian Jurgeon Moltmann once put it, "Darkness and night, these are always symbols for the Godforsakeness of the world. The lostness of men and women. In the darkness, we see nothing and no longer know where we are." There is an apt passage in the book of Isaiah, "Watchman, what of the night?"... The Watchman answers, "The morning comes, but it is night still..." But Paul, Christ's witness proclaims, "The night is far gone, the day is at hand

Let us in cast off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light." So it is time to get up from sleep, to forget the dreams and the night terrors, and to experience life in the light of God's new day, which is now dawning... "Get up," says Christ to the benumbed disciples, "let us be going." So let us also go with eager attentiveness to each new day. We are expected!"

Things have changed since Isaiah. We are on the other side of Easter. The light is dawning and in the world! We have been given a lantern in the dark. The light is Christ Jesus. Let us haste the day for His return, calling all people out of shadow! Calling all people the glorius hope found in the Christ Child. Come Down, Lord!
