Remember, Repent, and Renew

Greetings, beloved of Christ! It has been a joy getting to know this congregation! I am looking forward to meeting every one of you. My family and I are richly blessed! The legacy and faithfulness displayed by St. Luke Joy over the years, warms my heart. I think of the Apostle Paul's words from Colossians chapter 1:

"I always thank God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, when I pray for you, because I have heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and of the love you have for all God's people— the faith and love that spring from the hope stored up for you in heaven and about which you have already heard in the true message of the gospel that has come to you. In the same way, the gospel is bearing fruit and growing throughout the whole world—just as it has been doing among you since the day you heard it and truly understood God's grace. You learned it from Epaphras (Wallace, Melvin, Joe, and Mark), our dear fellow servant(s), who are faithful minister(s) of Christ on our behalf, and who also told us of your love in the Spirit."

As we begin our journey together, I encourage you to look carefully at three points behind Paul's words.

1.) Remember: It is good to remember and celebrate what God has done with St. Luke Joy! Not only that, but what God has done for you individually! Remember how your faith has grown and the joy of your salvation (Psalm 51:12)! Think of the faithful men and women who have served Christ throughout the years. Think of all the families that have passed through our doors and heard the gospel! Do you remember when you first heard the good news? Each Sunday, I will be looking for someone willing to share their testimony of salvation with our congregation. Our testimonies are vital! We must go back to the beginning of our initial motivation for being a church body. We are not merely here to "do church" or keep the lights on. We are here to give testimony to what Christ has done in our lives and for the world! As it says in Revelation 12:11, *"They triumphed over him (the Devil) by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of their testimony."*

2.) Repent: In the book of Revelation, Jesus spoke directly to several churches. Many of these churches had been in operation for some time! The church in Ephesus had been open for over 40 years! In Chapter 2, Jesus gets right to the heart of the matter. He starts by complimenting the church's holiness and sound doctrine. Jesus then goes on to say these stark words. *"Yet I hold this against you: You have forsaken the love you had at first.*



Remember, Repent, and Renew

Consider how far you have fallen! Repent and do the things you did at first. If you do not repent, I will come to you and remove your lampstand from its place." We must "remember" our first love! Remember the love of Christ, our Savior, that was freely given to us. We must be a people of continual repentance. As time goes on, it is easy to take on other "loves." The key to a healthy church is repentance. Ask God, "how have I forsaken you?"

3.) Renew: Therefore, let us be a simple church. Jesus commands us to get back to the basics! The "things we did in the beginning." In everything we do, we must ask, "How does this give glory and honor to Christ?" Every great renewal must start with prayer and confession. Let us confess the ways we have strayed from God and His will. Let us confess our other "loves."

Will you pray? Without prayer, there can be no renewal.

Starting this Sunday, we will begin a short series on "revival" from Isaiah 63 and 64. Renewal and revival is a work of the Holy Spirit. You can not fabricate or manipulate it. Therefore, we must lean wholly and consistently on God's power. This series will be leading us up to the Advent season!

It is a new day at St. Luke Joy. God is calling us into a new chapter of ministry. Let us have grace for one another as we enter this season. If we put God first, repent, and live according to His will, there is no telling what He can do! I ask you to "ponder anew what the Almighty can do!"


